Mr. Booker nominated Mr. Williams. Mr. Bierman called for the nominations to cease. Mr. Williams called for a vote and the vote was 6-0 in favor of Mr. Williams remaining as president.

Mr. Booker moved to approve the Architecture Agreement with Reliance Architecture for the construction of the athletic facility as presented and per recommendation by Hector Martinez, Superintendent, seconded by Mr.

ic Facility Bierman and the motion carried 6-0.

Accept Bid for Dr. Martinez explained the bid being presented is not in addition to the wehicle bids presented and approved in September. The two single cab

vehicles purchased from Solana Motors have not been delivered and are not being produced any longer. He stated he talked to the attorney and was told the district will have to go out for bids once again. After talking with Solana Motors, the extended or crew cab is still being produced and the district could receive the vehicles within 6 weeks or so. Solana Motors did send the district a letter stating the single cab vehicles are no longer being produced. The only bid that came in for two extended cab vehicles was from Solana Motors in the amount of \$43,990 per each vehicle. Mr. Enger moved to accept the bid of \$43,990 for each of the two extended cab vehicles per recommendation by Dr. Martinez, seconded by Ms. Raybion and motion carried 6-0.

Richard Sweaney, Assistant Superintendent, gave a report on the high school state assessments. The goal for the high school was to accomplish 90 % to approach grade level, 60% to meet grade level and 30% to master grade level. The campus did in fact fulfill this goal in the majority of the subject areas. The campus also exceeded both state and region in multiple areas. The state has adjusted the accountability measures which means district ratings will decrease. This change will affect 68% of all districts. Another note he stated was CCMR was not included in these percentages which is a total of 40% of the rating.
